Honor Bell Tolls For Veterans

Defense Department cutbacks are sadly causing many of the over 1,000 Veterans laid to rest in America every day to be buried without the full military honors required by the National Defense Authorization Act.

The nonprofit Honor Bell Foundation, founded in Denver by Louis Olivera, unveiled a response to the situation at Fort Logan National Cemetery this past Memorial Day in the shape of a three-foot-wide, 1,000 pound bell.

The Honor Bell is the first of its kind in the country, and the first bell cast in U.S. history for the sole purpose of rendering final honors to Veterans.

Olivera got the idea after attending a funeral at Fort Logan. He recruited friends and colleagues to raise funds and form a staff. He contacted a bell foundry in Cincinnati, Ohio in business since 1842 and learned the casting process hasn't changed in more than six centuries. A deep sounding bell must be made from solid bronze and be at least 37 inches in diameter.

But Olivera also had the idea of including melted-down Veterans' artifacts in the casting. The families of 12 deceased Colorado Veterans from all five service branches and all major conflicts since WWII donated dog tags, medals, insignia, belt buckles, buttons, and other military memorabilia from their loved ones to become part of the Honor Bell. Their combined size was no larger than a soda can, or about 0.1 percent of the bronze bell. Yet they appear as slight markings in the sides of the bell.

After casting, the first Honor Bell Ceremony took

place as part of Major League Baseball's celebration of Armed Forces Day at the Great American Ball Park, home of the Cincinnati Reds. It was then escorted to Colorado by members of Rolling Thunder and the Patriot Guard Riders. The Honor Bell was dedicated in a 2016 Memorial Day Ceremony at Fort Logan.

"The bell is forged from honor," according to Olivera, who is now Executive Director of the Foundation. It hosts a circular formation of seven stars, including a raised gold star in honor of surviving spouses, parents, and family members of those killed in combat.

A special van with a back-door slide mechanism is used to transport the bell to ceremonies at Fort Logan. Hearing it is a moving experience. Honor bells are tuned to mourning. Seven solemnly-paced notes are struck to communicate depth of sorrow and extent of loss. Seven signifies completeness. The dignity, traditions, and simplicity of military funeral services are compliment-

ed beautifully by the Honor Bell's notes of reverence.

Eventually Olivera wants to put bells, each costing \$50,000, in every U.S. National Cemetery (133). The very first Honor Bell will remain at Fort Logan, with the 100,000 Veterans resting there.

Bell Honors are a complimentary service offered to any service member being buried at Fort Logan National Cemetery. To donate to the Honor Bell Foundation, serve as a volunteer for the Honor Bell Guard, or request a service, go to honorbell.org.
