

Changes to Newsletter Distribution Announced

Beginning with the January, 2019 issue, Post 178 members who live in the metro area will no longer have a printed newsletter and monthly calendar delivered by the U.S. Post Office. Only out-of-state members will continue receiving their copies by surface mail.

This decision was enacted by vote in the Legion's November monthly members' meeting. It is being done to save money. The Post spends over \$8,000 annually to produce and distribute the monthly newsletter, and the cost of postage is projected to increase soon.

A limited number of printed newsletters and calendars will be available for members at the Post the first of every month. We will continue sending members the newsletter, calendar, and daily draw by e-mail.


