# The American Legion Turns 100

March 15—17, 1919, marks the 100th anniversary of The American Legion, founded to assist veterans, service members, and local communities. The organization has grown into one of the most influential nonprofit groups in America. Today, more than 2 million members occupy over 13,000 Posts worldwide. The Legion has won countless benefits for veterans, established lasting programs for children and youth, and played a positive roll in social change.

Mar. 15, 1919	World War I veterans of the American Expeditionary Force meet in Paris, France to establish the Legion.			
May 8, 1919	"The American Legion" becomes the official name.			
June 9, 1919	The American Legion emblem adopted.			
Sept. 16, 1919	Congress charters The American Legion.			
Nov. 10, 1919	First Legion convention in Minneapolis. Constitution adopted. Resolution passed to support the Boy Scouts of America.			
Aug. 9, 1921	Legion efforts create the U.S. Veterans Bureau, forerunner of the VA.			
June 15, 1923	First "Flag Code" drafted. Adopted by Congress in 1942.			
July 25, 1917	American Legion Baseball program created. Over 50% of current Major League players are graduates of Legion Baseball.			
Sept. 1932	Sons of The American Legion officially recognized.			
June 23, 1935	First American Legion Boys State convenes.			
June 1, 1938	First annual National High School Oratorical contest conducted.			
June 22, 1944	GI Bill becomes law based on a draft written by Past National Commander Harry Colmery.			
May 29,1946	Legion and Auxiliary provide a large grant to the fledgling American Heart Association to inaugurate a nationwide program of prevention.			
July 9, 1954	The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation formed. To date, more than \$11 million has been awarded to groups that help children.			
Sept. 1, 1966	The Legion voices great concern for the fate of POW/MIAs and continues to press for a full accounting.			
Aug. 24, 1969	National Emergency Fund established after Hurricane Camille.			
April 1, 1975	Legion-sponsored Freedom Bell boards the Freedom Train for a tour of America in celebration of the bicentennial.			
Aug. 26, 1982	Legion gives \$1 million to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund for construction of the Wall, the largest single donation.			
Jan 1, 1989	VA elevated to Cabinet-level status after backing by the Legion.			
Aug. 2, 1990	Legion sues the federal government for failure to conduct a Congress-mandated study about the effects of Agent Orange.			
June 15, 1991	Legion hosts first Junior Shooting Sports Championship in Colorado Springs. Today, more then 2,000 high school students participate.			
Aug. 24, 1994	Legion created the Citizens Flag Alliance to work toward a constitutional amendment to protect the U.S. flag from physical desecration.			
Oct. 1, 1995	Persian Gulf Task Force formed to assist veterans of the conflicts.			
Sept. 16, 1996	National Emergency Fund surpasses \$1 million in grants to victims.			
Sept. 3, 1997	First National Law Enforcement Officer of the Year award presented.			
Oct. 17, 2007	Legion Riders adopted as a national program of the American Legion.			
October, 2012	VA guarantees 20 millionth home loan as part of the GI Bill of Rights.			
August, 2017	Denise Rohan elected first woman National Commander of the Legion.




# Joe Bowers February Volunteer of the Month
