LEGION Act Expands Membership

The bipartisan bill known as the The LEGION Act (Let Everyone Get Involved in Opportunities for National Service Act) was signed by President Trump on July 30th. It is a significant legislative victory for The American Legion, which had sought to honor approximately 1,600 U.S. service members killed or wounded during previously undeclared periods of war. The LEGION Act also opens the door for approximately 6 million veterans to access American Legion programs and benefits for which they previously had not been eligible.

The legislation immediately changes The American Legion's eligibility criteria from seven war eras, as previously defined by Congress, to two: April 6, 1917,

to Nov. 11, 1918, and Dec. 7, 1941 to a date later determined by the federal government. Veterans who were honorably discharged but whose service did not fall into the previously defined war eras may now join The American Legion. No other restrictions to Legion membership are changed.

Membership criteria will also change for the Sons and Auxiliary to reflect the newly defined war eras. (Sons and grandsons of veterans, living or deceased, are eligible to join SAL. The Auxiliary is open to grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives, and direct and adopted female descendants of eligible veterans).

"We are grateful that President Trump fully acknowledges the importance of The American Legion by signing the LEGION Act," National Commander Brett Reistad said. "In an era of partisan gridlock, Republicans and Democrats in Congress overwhelmingly recognized the importance of allowing thousands of honorable but previously ineligible veterans the right to join the largest and most influential veterans organization in the country.

"Recognizing the service of these wartime veterans is the right thing do. The American Legion's founding fathers believed 'a veteran is a veteran.' We are proud to welcome any of the six million living veterans from the previously unrecognized periods into our organization

and call them 'Legionnaires'"

A number of veterans have already become members of Post 178 thanks to the LEGION Act. "We want all of our members to realize the significance of this opportunity," said Post Commander, Mark Ward. "Our members are our best recruiters. We need new members going forward to continue our programs for veterans and keep our doors open."

American Legion Auxiliary Girls Nation is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for young women. This week-long event gives participants a firsthand experience with practical insight into how the federal government works. More than 7,000 have participated in ALA Girls Nation since it was founded in 1947.

Two participants are chosen from each state after participating in their respective *ALA Girls State* programs. The girls are known as "senators." During ALA Girls Nation in Washington, D.C., the girls participate in a mock legislature. They are responsible for submitting bills and resolutions, participating in senate sessions, and electing officials such as president and vice president.

Participants leave ALA Girls Nation with leadership lessons for life and an understanding of the fundamentals of U.S. government, along with the rights, privileges, and responsibilities of citizens. This seven-day experience has laid the foundation

for thousands of bright futures in not only public service, but other careers as well. Some notable industries include government, military, law, education, and media.
