Once in a Lifetime Adventure, "Tiger Cruise 1"

Brian and I recently had the honor and privilege to experience the sailors life as part of a Tiger Cruise. Our son John was stationed aboard the USS John C Stennis aircraft carrier. On rare occasion, family members are invited to stay on the carrier from one port to the next, to experience how our sailor lives. We were known as Tigers!

After going through check-in (security, getting badges and memorabilia) our sponsors directed us to our "racks" (sleeping quarters). We were advised to bring a medium sized duffel bag that could be stored in a VERY SMALL locker. The rack (bed) lifts up so you can store your clothes and personal items under your mattress.

Each Tiger is assigned a sponsor of the same gender. The berthing areas are separated into male and female sections. This wasn't just a pleasure cruise. We got to dress up as a firefighter,



tour the ship, view the ammunition bay, forecastle, and a million other things. And of course, no cruise would be complete without your own private air show viewed from the flight deck!! Incredible!

We watched from the tower while jets took off and landed. It was amazing to see the choreographed movements on the flight deck with everyone wearing color coded uniforms to signify their duties. There's activity on every part of the flight deck. Some sailors stand around an E-2 radar aircraft so no one will walk into the propeller blades. Several jets simultaneously move into positions to

be launched by one of the four catapults. At the same time a Hilo is taking off and landing at the stern (back) of the ship! Fire and safety crews are standing by. I could have stayed there forever!

Moving from deck to deck is done through ladder wells! We did about 44 ladders a DAY, and walked over nine miles each day! Talk about a workout! It was wonderful to learn so many things

about life on the ship; being away from family and friends, dealing with cramped quarters, extremes in temperatures, and DANGEROUS conditions if you're not watching out, and careful with your everyday activities.

All of the sailors we met were proud of their service, and appreciative of our support. This brought a new appreciation for all that our brave sailors go through! Their service is immeasurable!


