

Harlem Globetrotters Trace Roots to American Legion

In the mid-1920s, a semi-professional African-American basketball team was formed on the South Side of Chicago that played under the banner and sponsorship of **George L. Giles Post 87 of The American Legion.** Its nucleus was a group of graduates from Wendell Phillips High School. The *"Giles Post"* team played in Chicago and

the surrounding area, racking up an impressive record.

They became the "*Savoy Big Five*" while playing exhibition games at the Savoy Ballroom to help boost the dance hall's sagging attendance. When a Jewish promoter from the North Side of the city named Abe Saperstein became the team's manager in 1926, he changed their name to the "*New York Harlem Globe Trotters*" to assert out-or-town status and capitalize on Harlem's recognition as the center of African-American culture.

In January 1927, the team played a game in Hinckley, IL that is credited by the Globetrotters as its first game. Through the early 1950s, the Globetrotters were

one of the finest basketball teams in the world, winning the World Professional Basketball Tournament in 1940 and twice defeating the NBA World Champion Minneapolis Lakers in 1948 and '49.

The Globetrotters went international in 1950. They played in Berlin's Olympic Stadium in 1951 before 75,000 spectators, and traveled to the USSR in 1959.

Eventually the Globetrotters were eclipsed by the rise of the National Basketball Association after NBA teams began including African-American players in the 1940s, they had worked a variety of comic routines into their act, and eventually became known more for entertainment than sports.

Their trademark antics feature incredible coordination and skillful handling of one or more basketballs, precision passing or juggling balls between players, balancing or spinning balls on their fingertips, and making unusually difficult shots. The team popularized the slam dunk, the fast break, the forward and point guard positions, and the figure-eight weave.

Saperstein died in 1966, the year of the team's official 40th anniversary. Saperstein, his team, and several

> of his players are enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Approximately 750 men and women have played for the world famous team, entertaining popes, kings, queens, presidents, and audiences of all ages.
