Post Provides Proper U.S. Flag Retirement

There isn't a more beautiful sight than a high-flying American flag. Many of us proudly fly the U.S. flag at our homes and places of work, but when it's old and torn we don't want to just throw it in the trash like any other old item. That would be disrespectful. When a flag is no longer a fitting symbol to display, it should be retired in a dignified way.

In 1923 the National Flag Conference met in Washington to create the Flag Code which established rules for properly displaying the flag. The Code states, "the flag represents a living country and is itself considered a living thing."

Because the flag is considered a sacred symbol, The American Legion passed a resolution about flag retirement ceremonies in



1937 that includes an important ritual of observance. According to the resolution, the approved method of disposing of unserviceable flags is that they be destroyed by burning during a specific and dignified ceremony.

Flag Day, observed annually on June 14th, is considered the most appropriate day to hold flag disposal ceremonies. During a typical American Legion Flag Day Ceremony the colors are presented and a chaplain offers a prayer. The Pledge of Allegiance is recited and the National Anthem played. Flags folded in the familiar triangle pattern are presented to a Legion official for inspection before being placed into a controlled fire. A bugler sounds "To the Colors" and a 21gun salute is sounded.

Chuck Elsen, retired Navy Chief Petty Officer, has designed a box to collect worn out U.S. Flags and placed it outside the front of Post 178 at the northeast corner of our building. Flags deposited in the collection box will be retired in a dignified manner. Chuck served 20 years in the Navy Submarine Service and has been a member of the Lakewood American Legion for 8 years. He is also the artist who paints the unit insignias on our ceiling tiles.
