American Legion Racers Dominate IndyCar

Last February, IndyCar driver Alex Palou spoke with NBC Sports about representing The American Legion and its Be The One Veterans suicide prevention program. He shared how an active-duty service member attending

the opening race of the season spoke with Legion staff at the organization's trackside display about thoughts of suicide. He was immediately put in touch

with mental health specialists and connected with members of the American Legion Family.

"He's now surrounded by all The American Legion

folks. We saved that life," Palou said. "I'm so proud and privileged to be racing for a cause...with The American Legion and their Be the One campaign. I think that we're raising the awareness of the issue. It all starts by just asking our Veterans if they need help. You never know. You can be the one to save a Veteran's life today."

The 27-year-old Spaniard driving for Chip Ganassi Racing did his part throughout the season chalking up five wins and 10 podiums and claiming the pole at the 107th running of the Indianapolis 500 with the fastest ever four-lap average of 234.217mph. He finished fourth

in the Memorial Day race. At season's end was the runaway 2023 NTT IndyCar Series Champion.

Another CGR driver. Marcus Armstrong, also wearing American Legion livery, was the IndyCar Season

Rookie of the Year.

"Supporting our nation's Veterans is of immense importance to our organization and we are humbled to continue

supporting The American Legion's mission in ending Veteran suicide," said Team Owner Chip Ganassi. "We will do absolutely everything we can to help Veterans get

the support they need while raising public awareness of the 'Be The One' platform."

The partnership has delivered measurable results for The American Legion over the last two years including new memberships, fundraising, and overall media reach far surpassing previous marketing goals for

The American Legion.
