Dick Surratt (5/10/1939 - 10/22/2024)

U.S. Army Veteran, Dick Surratt, a noted midget racer turned drag racer and long-time member of Post 178, passed away October 22nd at age 85. He was the Special Honoree at the Post's 2016 Car Show. Artist



Jerry Potts created award plaques that year featuring a unique rendering of Dick's front-engine dragster. Dick won awards at other Post 178 Car Shows with his 1931 Chevrolet "Vicky" and 1965 Ford Mustang. After his military service, Dick went to work as a mechanic for Cen-

tric Elevator Corporation. He founded his own company, Vertical Transportation Maintenance (VTM), in 1993 and following retirement sold it to Centric in 2005.

Dick's lifelong passion was racing. He loved racing on dirt, and was an accomplished midget racer competing locally at Englewood, Lakeside, and Rocky Mountain Speedways as well as venues from coast-to-coast. He was well-known and well-liked, and counted Tony Stewart among his many top-tier racing associates.

When health issues forced him to give up midget racing, he undertook the challenge of building a dragster in his well-equipped home garage. Dick's front-engine "Half Fast" dragster, so-named for it's supercharged 4-cylinder Pontiac Tempest engine, was the same configuration conceived by one of his heroes, the legendary Mickey Thompson. Thompson set a record with his ver-

sion in 1967 which had never been broken.

In 2018, Dick and his team of Ken Lawrence, Don McIntire Jr., Don McIntire III, Larry Parenteau, and son Ken, covered the quartermile in 8.84 seconds at 149 mph, eclipsing



Thompson's 9.50 elapsed time. It was a significant accomplishment in Dick's life and the sport of drag racing.

Dick is survived by wife, Betty; son, Kenneth; daughter, Penny Murrison; and grandchildren Kcycee, Cori, and Cody. He was one-of-a-kind, and will be missed by the racing community and his many friends.
